

In the Women's Championship Birkenhead's Millie Nathan and Connie Mathieson won a thrilling final from an experienced Orewa combination of Elaine McClintock and Kerin Roberts.

This was a see-saw battle which could have gone either way. McClintock and Roberts, both centre gold stars, led 12-8 after 12 ends, only for the game to swing Birkenhead's way when they picked up a four on the 16th end for a four-shot lead.

Orewa just fell short with a two and a single on the final two ends to lose 17-16.

It was the fourth Centre title for Mathieson, who has dual Birkenhead and Takapuna membership, and the third for Nathan, another still in junior ranks.

Mathieson and Nathan also had a single shot win 15-14 over Takapuna's Lisa Dickson and Lauren Mills in the semi-finals and McClintock and Roberts recovered from a slow start to beat Birkenhead's Ruth Lynch and Bev Rolfe 15-8.

An impressive round of singles saw the guys pick up a further 13 points out of 16 to round out a very impressive 16-4 win on the day.

Darts – Did You Know?

Each week, The Stingers will bring you something interesting from the world of darts. The game itself likely originated in Medieval England in the first couple of decades of the 14th century (some believe it was French in origin) and so has a rich and varied history that led to the game we know and love today.

Did you know why the dartboard as we know it is numerically organized the way it is? Whilst it would be nice (well, easier) to have the board numerically sorted from high to low and top to bottom, the board is designed to make a dart players life tricky.

The number system on the board is credited to a Brian Gamlin, a carpenter from Bury, Lancashire, UK, who is said to have invented it at the age of 44 in 1896 but he sadly passed in 1903, without patenting his invention.

The system is designed in such a way that reduces the chances of 'lucky shots' and therefore the element of chance.

This is done with the placement of low scoring numbers either side of larger numbers e.g. 1 and 5 either side of 20 and 3 and 2 either side of 17. Miss the big number and you're almost certainly going to hit a much lower one!
