#### **Let the Battles Commence**

This Sunday the first of two Bowls New Zealand endorsed "Summer of Bowls" events rolls out on to the greens of Birkenhead. The \$5,500 Birkenhead Men's Pairs, with tournament partner Carpet Mill Archers Road, gets underway 8.15am on Sunday. The fact that the tournament was full back in early October, just speaks volumes of the popularity for a spot in this highly sort after tournament now in its tenth year. The regulars are back along with some new faces to keep the field honest. Sunday is all about securing a spot in the top half of the draw and a chance to chase the \$1,500 first prize and the Champions Cup.

Unknown at the time the full house sign went out, but as a result of the National Singles and Pairs in early January the following Champions and runners-up feature in the field. Mike Galloway National Singles Champion, Jamie Hill National Pairs Champion, **Graham Skellern National B5** B8 Pairs Champion, John Carruthers and Mike Bradford National Pairs runners-up. Round one and last years winners Manurewa Cossie's Roger Andrew and David Clark get their defence of the Champions Cup underway against Birkenhead's neighbours Northcote's Greg Taylor and Brent Malcom. David Eades makes a return to the pairs now playing out of Tauranga and with Helensville's ever

consistent Bart Robertson up against Howick's Neil Fisher and Bryan Chapman on the rink from hell B8. A Birkenhead/Royal Oak clash lines up when Birkenhead's Gary Stevens and late replacement Tony Grantham take on Royal Oak's Bill Whitburn and National Pairs runner-up John Carruthers The other half of the National Pairs runner-up combination Royal Oak's Mike Bradford has not taken his return to the pairs lightly with clubmate Zak Abro to help out first up against the Belmont Park/Takapuna pairing of Bradley James and John Janssen. Regulars Frankton Railway's Barry Rajendram and Pukekohe Cossie's Shaun Pennell clash, Rajendram with Richard Watt while Pennell has Jason Parker with him this year.

Round two sees the Gary Cotter skipped Carlton Cornwell pairing with past winner Wally Marsic up against Birkenhead's Mike Haggart and John Hindmarch, a pairing that is yet to show their true potential this season. Takapuna's and recent National B5 B8 Pairs Champion Graham Skellern has Tauranga's Ben Thurston off the front as they tackle the Point Chev young guns Alex Reed and Aiden Takarua. Runners-up in 2019 Royal Oak Mike Galloway, National Singles Champion, and Martin Dixon will have their work cut out against North Harbours most decorated player Browns Bay's Colin Rogan and clubmate Brian Wilson. Henderson's Tony Garelja, past winner with Wally Marsic, has Henderson's Billy Fulton looking after the mat and control of that mat will be required as when they meet Takapuna's Clayton Hockley and Mangere's Taylor Horn.

Round four and the business end of the day to secure a spot in the top sixteen. One of the many Royal Oak players in this years tournament James Gavin has tournament new comer Ellerslie's Bryce Mackie and finishes the day off up against the Royal Oak powerhouse of Galloway and Dixon. Battle of the westies sees regulars Pringle Park's Craig Harold and Steve Gaughan take on Fulton and Garelja. The Whangarei father and son pairing of David and Daniel Hood round out their day against Fisher and Chapman. While Riverhead's Bruce Baker and Birkenhead's Doug Campbell take on Rogan and Wilson.

Sunday sees the top eight seeded and playing knockout in the Champions Cup, while the bottom eight fight it out in the Consolation. The tournament culminates 3.30pm when five finals are played on the top green.

- Request family members to drop off/pick up after the days bowling has concluded. The Board would appreciate assistance with this, thereby enabling visitors who travel fur-

ther to avoid parking issues when they arrive at the club. Keep clear of the bar staff parking, it's a real problem when we don't have bar staff to open the bar after a hot day out on the greens.
