ANZAC Day at Birkenhead

After the past two years of firstly restrictions and then lockdown we can in 2021 return to honouring those Australians and New Zealanders who served and died in all wards, conflicts and peace keeping operations in the way we as Kiwis have become accustom to since 1916.


