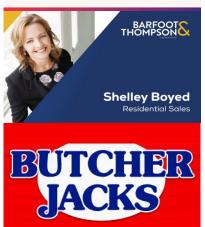

# **Entries for the 2021-2022 Summerset Nationals** are now open!

Bowls New Zealand is moving towards an online event management system for National Events in the 2021-2022 season, called BowlsHub Aotearoa.

BowlsHub Aotearoa will allow Bowls New Zealand to keep National Event results in one centralised location, along with the ability to maintain an accurate membership database that will help administer bowls at not only a National Level but at a Centre and Club level

Because of this exciting development, the process to enter National Events for the 2021-2022 season has changed, here's how.

- Every member entering a National Event in the 2021-2022 season will need to create a profile with BowlsHub Aotearoa.
  - This can be done by going to bowlshub.co.nz/signup, Once you've created an account you can log in to BowlsHub Aotearoa at www.bowlshub.co.nz (take note of your National ID/Membership number once you've logged in.)
- 2. Entering a National Event for the 2021-2022 season is done on BowlsHub Aotearoa. Once you've logged into BowlsHub Aotearoa navigate to "My Competitions" and you will be able enter the 2022 Summerset Nationals.
- If you're entering a pairs or fours event you will need to know the National ID/ Membership Number of every member in your team. If you're entering a pairs or fours event you will need to know the National ID/Membership Number of every member in your team. (Your teammates will know their National ID/Membership Number once they've signed up and logged in once)

- Singles-\$49.50
- Pairs-\$99.00
- Fours-\$198.00

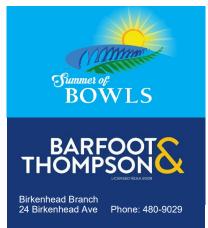

# A Vaccinated Bowls Community

A message from Bowls New Zealand CEO Mark Cameron

Extract from Bowls New Zealand CEO Mark Cameron's letter 28/10/21

Over the past few weeks, the Bowls New Zealand team has been fielding many questions from bowling clubs about the mandating of vaccination certificates within bowling clubs and at events.

This is definitely a hot topic not only for the bowls community, but the entire country. Bowls New Zealand is supportive of a vaccinated bowls community in 2022, so that we can protect our membership from covid-19. The Government's recent announcements promoting a new 'traffic light' system now means that every bowling club needs to consider if/how it supports a club member/visitor who does not have a vaccination certificate. Bowls New Zealand's position is this: "Bowls New Zealand encourages all bowling clubs to support our members being vaccinated against covid-19, so that we can reduce the risk of exposure and transmission of covid-19. It is important that we provide our club members (and visitors) with a safe community, in which they can play bowls and enjoy a wine/beer/water. A safe community is a covid-free community, and currently the best protection against spreading covid is vaccination." Further, and in support of a vaccinated bowls community this summer, Bowls New Zealand will only use Bowling Club facilities for 2022 National Events (Singles, Pairs, Fours and Mixed Pairs), that require a vaccination certificate for club entry - so, those that are coming to our 2022 Nationals in Canterbury (January), Taranaki (February), should be aware that we require our entrants to be vaccinated and our host clubs to require a vaccination certificate.

The final decision on vaccination certificates rests with each individual bowling club and its membership - Bowls New Zealand does not have the right to mandate how every bowling club conducts their individual business. Do you, once we move to the new Traffic Light Alert Levels, allow persons who do not have a vaccination certificate to play bowls and use your facility?

- If only people with a vaccination certificate can use your facility, then under Green, Orange and Red there are no significant limitations to running your bowling club.
  - 1. If you choose this option, then any staff/volunteers/contractors (including F&B) will need to be vaccinated.
- 2. If people without a vaccination certificate can use your facility, then:
  - 1. under Orange and Red, your facility will have significant restrictions this summer, including an inability to provide normal Food & Beverage hospitality.
  - 2. under **Green** your bowling club facility will be able to play bowls and enjoy the bar, but will have some H&S limitations (numbers, distancing).

There is more detail to the Traffic Light system and this can be found on the covid19 website: https://covid19.govt.nz/alert-levels-and-updates/covid-19-protection/. However, the above now gives us a pathway for how the bowls community can operate in the new (post 90%) Alert Levels.

Alas, we don't get to sit on the fence on this matter, as your members and customers will have a right to ask if your bowling club requires vaccination certificates – your community is entitled to know how safe your facilities are (especially hospitality) from covid exposure and transmission.

I appreciate that this is not an easy discussion for some bowling clubs, as you may have members (long-standing) who are not prepared to be vaccinated and who (under these new guidelines) may be lost to our sport and community. We need to respect these individual's rights to make a personal decision. Equally, we will need to also consider those that cannot be vaccinated, e.g. children under 12 and those who cannot be vaccinated for medical/health reasons.

Please also understand, that this communication is based upon the information currently available from Government – Bowls New Zealand (and you as a bowling club) should reserve the right to restate its position as we learn and understand more about how New Zealand manages the fight against covid-19 in our communities and workplaces. It may be that our/your position on vaccination certificates is reviewed in 3/6/12/24 months' time.

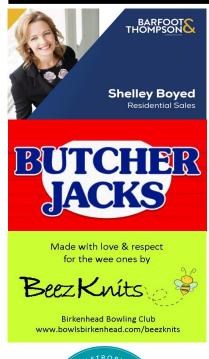
### Club for Hire
