#### Opened!!

Just after 6pm last Friday, if you blinked you would have missed it, but it did happen. The Birkenhead Bowling Club finally after three long months, officially opened the 2021-22 season with little fanfare and no guest speaker, creams or blue jackets in sight, very casual. President Randall Watkins opened the proceedings introducing Parton Shane Prince, who made a short speech urging everyone to work together to get through the truncated season ahead. Attention then turned to the green where Evan Thomas raised the flag, Warren Lush put the first jack down, Trish Croot straightened it, and Terry Moverley put the first bowl down to a rousing applause from the members. Then it was back to enjoying the rest of the evening the Birkenhead way.

#### With Restrictions

The Birkenhead Bowling Club Clubroom reopened last Friday operating under the new Traffic Light Protection Framework.

Initially Auckland will be under Traffic Light Red which has the following restrictions for the hospitality industry that affect the operation of our club:

- Maximum 100 people in the clubrooms
- Members to remain seated which precludes darts, Warren Lush delivering the first jack pool, and dancing from being allowed
- All members and their guests must have proof of double vaccination to be able to enter the clubrooms and greens - this is the law and NO EXCEPTIONS
- Entry to the club and greens during bar opening times is via the main entrance to assist staff in obtaining proof of vaccination status
- Children under 12 are not legally able to be vaccinated and are therefore exempt from the vaccine pass requirements
- The Club is focused on offering a welcoming, safe environment for everyone. All staff are double vaccinated, an extensive cleaning program is in place for the clubrooms
- Leading up to Christmas. Continuous Ham and Salmon raffles will be offered and meat raffles Friday night from 4.30pm.
- The Members Draw will recommence when we reach ORANGE Traffic Light
- All gaming machines will be on but members are required to be seated, 1 metre separation, wear masks and cannot have any drinks or food in the gaming room.

Well I will wind up now as man-flu is taking a grip of me and I need to phone my wife and tell her all about it.


Take care out there and remember.....be kind on the greens, otherwise you'll have to apologise!.

#### **Don't Leave Home Without It**


