Clubrooms & Greens are Open, with restrictions

My Vaccine Pass required to enter Club premises

New Zealand is currently at Red Traffic Light of the Government's Covid Protection Framework. 

Yes, in amongst the latest upheaval to our daily lives some things remain unchanged. The last Friday in the month is \$5 Friday and January is no exception. #### Red Setting

- We must sight all customers' My Vaccine Passes, and it is strongly recommended we verify.

#### 100 limit!

One of the restrictions under Red Traffic Light is a 100 person limit and based on 1m distancing. Out on the greens we don't have a problem, but inside the Clubrooms we must be mindful of this requirement.

At tournaments preference will be given to participants and officials. Friday Club night preference is to Club members.

Unfortunately, due to lack of entries the Club has reluctantly made the disappointing decision to cancel the upcoming Charity Tournament on Saturday 5 February.

Thank you to those that had entered, you are no doubt as disappointed as we are at having to cancel. Thanks to all those individuals and companies that have gifted items and services to have been raffled and auction off on the day, we will be in touch with you all individually. The Birkenhead RSA has confirmed the \$500 they contribute will still be fourth coming for Hospice. The Sole Agents function with ticket sales going to Hospice may see some items raffled and auctioned for Hospice that night. The rest may be raffled and auctioned off at various tournaments/events during the year. We may have lost the bowling day but the Club is still dedicated to raising as much money as possible in support of Harbour Hospice.

#### Two Life Fours

Not often at Birkenhead is a Men's Championship played under the Two Life System, but this seasons Men's Four commencied last Saturday is just such a Championship with only five entries.

First round with all teams cock-a-hoot, two lives and ideas of holding the fours trophy aloft. Sandy Cleghorn's four with Mick Moodie, Gary Wallace and Robbie Henson met Nigel Drew and co, Lionel Drew, Martin Short and Mark Rumble with Drew dropping below the line going down (16-8). John Hindmarch with Mike Haggart, Dennis McSweeney and Warren Lush defeated Joseph Korkis, Vaughan Henderson, John Hannan and Sydney Walker (15-13).

Second round with Steve Yates coming off the bye from the first round with Jack Huriwai Jimmy Heath and Adam Richardson struck Hindmarch. Hindmarch initially took the lead, leading by one shot after the tenth end (10-9). Yates then won the next four out of five ends to end up on the right side of the ledger with a win (19-11). The battle below the line Drew was never troubled by Korkis, up by fourteen shots (15-1) after eight ends, and finished the fifteenth end ahead (16-8) to send Korkis home.

Cleghorn having the bye in the second round was know time to turn it on against the only other remaining two lifer, Yates. The initial lead was taken by Yates up (7-5) after seven ends before Cleghorn held it until Yates pegged it back to be ahead (12-11) after eleven ends. Pretty much one way traffic from here as Yates stepped out the lead to be ahead (15-11) going into the last. Cleghorn picked up a three on the final end but not enough to snatch the win, which was all Yates (15-14). In doing so Yates had secured the bye in round four and straight into a potential final with two lives.

Below the line was Drew and Hindmarch, the winner to play Cleghorn for the spot opposite Yates. The Drew v Hindmarch clash promised much but delivered a surprisingly one-sided game with Hindmarch pulling the pin after ten ends and trailing by fifteen shots, a win to Drew (19-4). Drew will now meet Cleghorn on Saturday 19 March, if not sooner, with the winner having to beat Yates's four twice to claim the Championship.

### My Vaccine Pass Booster Update

Many have had their Covid booster shot and may not be aware to update their My Vaccine Pass. The booster shot, not only gives further protection but extends the expiry date on your pass.

To update your My Vaccine Pass go to My Vaccine Pass at https://covid19.govt.nz and request a pass (same process as your first pass).

To request a pass (and it's easy)

- 1. Log in or sign up to My Covid Record
- 2. In the 'Passes and certificates' section, select 'Request pass or certificate'.
- 3. The 'Select a pass or certificate' screen will open. Select 'My Vaccine Pass' and then select 'Continue'.
- 4. In the 'Your details' screen, enter the email address that your vaccine pass should be sent to and select 'Request pass'. A confirmation screen will appear.
- 5. You should get an email with your pass within 24 hours.

Select the relevant link in the email and download to your phone.

Your existing certificate should automatically update with the new extended expiry date.

### Taranaki Open

Sunday 16th January saw the Birkenhead team of Chad Nathan, Peter Nathan, Evan Thomas and Mairangi Bay ring-in David Payne (together with team Manager Cheryl Thomas) travel to New Plymouth to participate in the 117th edition Taranaki Open Men's Fours. With an expectation of hoping to at least qualify (needing 6 wins from 8 section play games to do so) this was no easy task, with 158 teams of fours participating. Our first game was at Fitzroy Bowling Club so Sunday afternoon saw us having a practice there on their green and team positions confirmed. After an enjoyable complimentary BBQ at Fitzroy that evening we re-convened at Fitzroy next morning. About ten minutes prior to play another team meeting was held, team positions were altered, and we commenced

We successfully negotiated teams from Te Kuiti and locals Fitzroy to go home satisfied with two wins for the day.

Tuesday saw play recommence at West End Bowling club. A quick team meeting by the teams Brains Trust confirmed the same playing positions from the previous day, and again were successful against teams from Paritutu and Manaia - so far so good with four

Wednesday saw us at Vogeltown and we managed a win against a team from Inglewood. Five from five - how easy is this game!

The last game on Wednesday saw us up against a strong team led by renowned NZ bowler Maurice Symes. With windy conditions on a quick green Maurice showed us how this game can be played under difficult conditions, and we were beaten 11-25 – the game now not so easy. Maurice played superbly against us, well supported by his team members, including Paul Matheson.

So with one further win required to qualify with two games remaining we ventured down to Inglewood Bowling club on Thursday, and managed to beat a team from Te Puke so we achieved our six wins, and were not required to play our eighth game. So in a way, mission accomplished.

From the 158 teams entered, 38 teams managed to qualify with the 6 wins from 8 games. So being quite pleased with ourselves with our qualification, we were a bit worried when

we saw our post section draw as against Wanganui great Peter Belliss with his Aramoho team. Peter's team was the only team to win eight from eight in section play. Our game was scheduled for Friday afternoon on the slick Paritutu B green, so bags were packed, cars loaded, ready for the return trip to Auckland following the game so as to be able to play in the Birkenhead club fours the following morning. Again the team brains trust called a meeting prior to the game to determine if team posi-

tions should be changed but team management made a call that no, leave the team as is given it had worked thus far, despite again tricky conditions with a gusty wind prevailing. #### Twelve to Two

Twelve teams lined up for this seasons Men's Championship Triples, including Evan Thomas's triple with Peter and Chad Nathan, all three fresh from a week of bowls at the Taranaki Men's Open. Last seasons Triples Champions, Jimmy Heath, Jack Huriwai and Steve Yates were aback along with the bookies favourite Mark Rumble, Martin Short and Nigel Drew. John Hindmarch with regular team man Mike Haggart and Steve Arms off the front, on paper looked good.

Round one of four to see who qualified: Hindmarch surprised all with a sound win (21-11) over Yates. Thomas had a narrow win over N Drew (18-16).

Round two: Lionel Drew with Keith Burgess and Adam Richardson continued their winning way with a (29-9) spanking, with Hindmarch waving the white flag after 15 ends. N.Drew made up for the first-round loss easily accounting for John Croy, Dougle Campbell and Mick Moodie (25-6). Yates picked up his first win (22-5) beating Warren Lush, Curtis Ennor and Robbie Church. Thomas walked away with another win (22-7) against Sydney Walker, John Hannan and Joseph Korkis (s).

Round Three: Only L.Drew and Thomas remain undefeated. Thomas carried on his winning way (14-9) with what was a tight game against Church. The battle of father and son or Drew and Drew with the son, Nigel, needing the win to have any hope of qualifying lead from the start and came away with a comfortable win (21-10). Yates made hard work of his game against Korkis, dropping six shots on ends 16 & 17 to trail by two going into the last. But a three on the last end gave Yates a one shot victory (15-14) Round Four: Korkis upset L.Drew beating him (15-9) and ending his triples hopes of quali-

fying. Thomas was due to take on Hindmarch, but Thomas had qualified and Hindmarch couldn't, so the two teams adjourned to the clubrooms for some chilled refreshments. Church pulled one out of the bag to end Moodie's hopes (23-9). 


