





Triples and Singles

Last weekend Birkenhead Headquartered the Centre Women's Triples and Men's Singles. Birkenhead's sole Women's Triples entry Ruth Lynch, Milika Nathan and Loz Croot won two of their three section play games at Browns Bay. But so did two other teams in their section, leaving Lynch's trio in third place in the section and dipping out of a playoff spot Sunday.

While the ladies were at it at Browns Bay, Birkenhead hosted four of the fifteen sections in this seasons Centre Men's Singles. Both Birkenhead's Mark Cartwright, having not played much this season, and Adam Richardson performed well on their home greens, both with two wins from three games. Adam only going down by one shot (21-20) to section winner Steve Cox and just being pipped by Orewa's Willie McIvor for the "Next Best Section Player" spot in Sunday's post section.

Sunday's post section and Birkenhead's hopes, on a home green, sat with Daymon Pierson. Dual member Gary Wallace had made post section but playing under Orewa. Wallace struck Browns Bay's Colin Rogan first up with Rogan giving Wallace a lesson in singles play (21-3) to see Wallace home for morning tea. Pierson up against Manly's Kevin Rainsford took it in his stride to move to the last eight with a solid win (21-15). Last eight or quarters, Pierson had his work cut out against a vastly more experienced Neil Fisher. Pierson quickly and possibly surprisingly found himself well up on Fisher, in fact in excess of ten shots or more. Fisher fruitlessly pulled back the shots before Pierson finally put the nail in the coffin with the jack driven into the ditch for the win (21-12). Semis and Browns Bay's Brian Wilson was next in Pierson's sights. Some telling bowls played by both but with Wilson proving the superior player this battle and Pierson bowing out (15-21). Wilson went onto play Helensville's Bart Robinson, defending BNH Centre Singles Champion and winner of multiple Centre Singles titles, in the final. A stunning final ensued with Wilson leading (19-18) when Robertson drew three shots to pull off a stunning win (21-19) and his tenth Harbour title for a bar.

BeeRewards Suspended or Voided

Besides being a requirement of the Club's Licence and Constitution having your current membership card on you enables you to collect and redeem BeeReward points over the upstairs bar. The BeeRewards points are non-transferable and may only be accrued and used by the card holder named on the card, if found using someone else's card you, them or both may have your BeeRewards suspended or voided. Remember when you scan your card your name comes up on the till in front of the bar staff.

Don't Waste Your Years

Too many 1-5 year bowlers waste their first five years, not playing all they can. Don't listen to the doom and gloomers that advise you to not play in tournaments and championships because you are new to the sport, not experienced enough or could get soundly beaten. It is a fact that you will lose more games of bowls than win them and there is no disgrace in that. The only way to improve and enjoy the sport to the fullest is to play, play, play and push yourself. We know we all now live in a PC world where if the minority had their way every game would be a draw and it's only about participation, but sport in reality is about winning to prove you're better than your opponent. You have five years to get as much experience out the sport before year six and you're out in the open class. Don't sit back, play everything you can, chances are the advice of "don't play because you're not up to it" came from someone that wasted their first five years. If you're still unsure seek the advice of a Club coach.





Meanwhile, despite atrocious weather conditions and two cancelled rounds, former New Zealand representative Wendy Jensen and Trish Hardy proved triumphant in the women's field, defeating Lisa Dickson and Judy Smith, 18-6.

Beaten semi-finalists were Jenny Stockford and Jo McKenna and Diane Strawbridge and Dawn Owens.

Across rinks, Central Otago duo Margaret O'Connor and Christine Buchanan proved too strong for Gaye Horne and Colleen Rice in the Cup A Flight, while Skye Renes and Keiko Kurohara took out the Cup B Flight opposite Catherine Bien and Ling Qu,
