


## 1-5 Fours with a Difference

Saturday, three teams competed for the Club 1-5 Year AC Fours Championship title. The format a two-life system but a departure from the one described in the Laws of the Sport or any lawn bowls draw manual. This version, origination unknown, sees the first-round byes come from the bottom and loser of subsequent rounds receive the bye and the charting is unique to say the least.

Round one Warren Lush, Stephanie Langford, Miranda Starck and Chad Nathan (s) where defeated comfortably by Mike Pugh, Mark Hitchcock, Mari Hannon and Milika Nathan (s) (12-23).

Round two and Milika Nathan's four having won the previous round had to take on John Hannon (s), Sydney Walker, Fay Judge and Bev Rolfe, while Chad Nathan's losing team sat out having been award the bye and time to reassess their first-round efforts. Unfortunately, Malika's four were defeated (5-14) in a game they never looked comfortable playing, but the reward for the loss was a bye in round three. The tables turned on Hannan's four in round three with Chad Nathan's four taking control from the first end and never taking the foot off the throat to secure the win (19-8) after thirteen of the fifteen ends played. Interesting to note that if played under the Laws of the Sport Milika Nathan's team would have played either team but with Milika going in with two lives and a possible different mindset and outcome.

The last round of the day should have been at the least a potential final, but it was a case of the winner of the round will play the team sitting out on a bye in the final. So it was siblings Chad Nathan against Milika Nathan both with one life with the winner playing John Hannon's four, also with one life. Chad stepped out to a thirteen-point lead after eight ends (15-2), the team never looked troubled finishing off Milika's team (18-6) after thirteen ends and sending Milika home. The final, both with one life, will see Chad Nathan's four take on John Hannan's four at a date to be determined.

## Birkenhead Win the Men's Interclub Sevens

Peter Nathan stepped into the illustrious shoes of international bowler Tony Grantham and filled them with distinction to spearhead Birkenhead to a deserved win in the North Har-

bour men's inter-club sevens competition at the weekend. With Grantham in trials for the Black Jacks Commonwealth Games team, Nathan replaced him as Birkenhead's singles specialist for the finals at Browns Bay and achieved a perfect record.

His 21-9 quarter-final win over Milford's Charlie McDonald anchored Birkenhead's 3-0 win in that match and his 21-6 win over Takapuna's Brent Malcolm in the semi-final helped Birkenhead to a 2-1 win in that contest.

Then in the final he accounted for Browns Bay's Brian Wilson, recently a close runner-up in the centre singles championships, 21-17 to provide one of the two wins Birkenhead needed to take the title.

Nathan's excellence was a reminder of his singles expertise. For as well as winning the centre mixed pairs with his talented daughter Millie in 2019 he himself was the centre singles champion in the 2013-14. As a junior with Glenfield in 2008 and 2010 he was the centre's one-to-five singles champion.

But it would be wrong to assume Birkenhead's success in the sevens was simply down to Nathan's heroics for overall it was an exemplary team effort.

Evan Thomas and Daymon Pierson were strong in the pairs as was the Nigel Drewskipped four of Jack Huriwai, Marty Short and Mark Rumble. Both in the qualifying rounds and on the final day Birkenhead was the essence of consistency.

Thomas and Pierson in particular were pivotal in the final, winning by one shot in a cliffhanger against Brown's Gideon van den Bergh and replacement player John Feast. Birkenhead's wins in the singles and pairs made the fours result irrelevant, with another tense contest between Drew's four and Browns Bay's Neil Fisher, John Walker, Lindsay Gilmore and Colin Rogan being called off at 11-all.

The sevens win capped off a rewarding few days for Birkenhead, with the club still rejoicing in the three-five victory from last weekend of Sandy Cleghorn, Robbie Henson and Maxe Janssen.

In the other quarter-finals Browns Bay beat Orewa 2-1 in another close contest, decided effectively in the singles by Wilson's 21-20 win over Willie McIvor, Mairangi Bay beat Riverhead 3-0 and Takapuna beat Helensville 2-1, with centre singles champion Bart Robertson Helensville's only winner.

In the semi-finals Browns Bay beat Mairangi Bay 2-1 and Birkenhead's only loss to Takapuna was in the pairs when Thomas and Pierson lost to Brett O'Riley and Jerry Belcher, the latter being in especially fine form.



## **Ross "Trust Me" Murray Tournament**

The Ross "Trust Me" Murray tournament (Wednesday 23 March) is held in memory of Ross Murray. Ross joined the Birkenhead Bowling Club in 1988 and over the next 20 years held various positions including Chairman of the Mid-week Match Committee, the Match Committee and was Secretary for a time. In 2009 he was made a life member of the club. In his autobiography, he describes himself as an innovator and always wanting to try something different. The tournament is no exception! The format is four games of 8 ends with Game 1 - three bowl Pairs, Game 2 - four bowl pairs (2x4x2), Game 3 - two bowl Triples and Game 4 - two bowl Fours.

Each player has his/her own card and records the points scored (each member of each team in each discipline scores the same). Bonus points (4 for a win, 2 for a draw) are added to the actual number of points scored).

To make this format work, a minimum of 24 players are needed and the draws need to be worked out a day in advance. Please put your names on the board at the Clubrooms so I can get in indication of how many are interested in playing. If we do not get enough interest the 23 March will revert to a club day.

## **Spotlight on Club Partners**

This week we put the spotlight on "The Birkenhead Licensing Trust". Although not a sponsor, but with the Trust's support over the years the club has benefited from many grants. Source http://www.birkenheadlicensingtrust.org.nz

The Trust is a net proceeds-committee of the Lion Foundation and is responsible for approving grant funding to the local community groups in Birkenhead and surrounding areas from gaming funds generated by Lion Foundation. The Birkenhead Licensing Trust was established in 1967 after voters decided that the Birkenhead Council area should change from 'dry' to 'wet' under the control of a licensing trust. In 1970 the Birkenhead Trust Hotel was opened, with catering facilities designed to cater for all locals. A period of expansion was followed by the economic slump of the late 1980s, the recipe for a loss-making enterprise. In 1992 the trust hotel complex was sold and only the wholesale outlet retained. The

Birkenhead Licensing Trust then sat for a number of years, accumulating revenue through the wholesale outlet and distributing interest accrued to local community groups. Meanwhile local licensing reins were loosened, allowing other operators to apply for licenses. In the interim the Trust sought other suitable sites. In 2002 the Slipp Inn Pub had been opened by Allen Vaughan, who had a long history with Lion Breweries. In 2006 the Trust approached Mr Vaughan with an offer to buy the Slipp Inn, as it seemed a good fit for several reasons: the Trust is a

net-proceeds committee of the Lion Foundation; grant funding to the local community comes from funds generated by Lion Foundation; the Trust was already the pub's land-lord; the pub fitted the family-friendly ideal of the Trust; and the gambling facility was a source of revenue. The Pub undertook extensive renovations and was reborn as "The Good Home Birkenhead" But, you ask, what is the difference between a Trust operation and a private or brewery owned enterprise? Well, all profits from bar and restaurant sales and gaming proceeds are distributed in the local community through the Lion Foundation, rather than going into a big national pool for distribution nationally. As Mr Vaughan points out, "The Trust does a lot of good in the community, it is not self-rewarding or ruled by self-interest, there are no paid directorships, and all six trustees are chosen by the electorate in the local body elections. As a result close to \$1 million annually has gone back into the community in recent years." The Trust also owns the Glenfield pub Inn Field; revenues go back into the Birkenhead, Glenfield and Northcote areas from both establishments.
