#### **Cadness Cup Held Over Three Weeks**

Birkenhead, skipped by a perennial favourite Lionel Drew, and Mairangi Bay, skipped by the ever-improving Gaye Horne, were the respective winners of this season's Cadness Cup inter-club competitions.

Drew inspired his Birkenhead line-up of Joseph Korkis, John Hannan and Jimmy Heath to a 21-16 win in the men's final against Pete Sheehan's Browns Bay four.

And Horne's Mairangi Bay outfit was too good for Takapuna's Megan Ratcliffe, Bet Leung, Lyn Calver and Irene Costello in the women's final.

Drew, long a stalwart of this competition and widely respected throughout the centre for his tactical acumen, was especially delighted to lead a team of battlers to a thoroughly satisfactory victory.

Despite his many years in the game, Drew has won surprisingly few centre titles, just three, the champion of champion fours with Milford in 1998-99 and with Birkenhead the championship pairs in 2003-04 and the champion of champion pairs in 2004-05. But he has so dominated the Cadness Cup he has forgotten how many times he has won it. The Birkenhead win enhanced what has been an excellent few weeks for the club, as did that for the Mairangi club of the Horne-skipped four.

Horne was equally delighted to win the women's version, particularly as her team of Hanaan Shahwan, Joy Watkinson and Rosemary Nicholl all but Watkinson are still one-to-five year bowlers. And Watkinson, winner of the one-to-five year any combination pairs title last season, is just one year out of juniors.

Ratcliffe's line-up performed creditably to make the final, particularly as on paper this was probably the less fancied of the two Takapuna entries in the competition. Though underachieving a little in the final, it did well in the semi-final to eliminate a strong Manly side.



#### **Women's Singles and Men's Dick Bree Triples**

Three of the centre's most seasoned players, Browns Bay's Neil Fisher, John Walker and Colin Rogan, edged further towards legendary status by winning the Dick Bree champion-ship triples at the weekend.

And at the same time, on an adjacent Mairangi Bay green, North Harbour's newest superstar, Takapuna's Selina Goddard achieved a career milestone by winning the women's championship singles.

That meant that in the comparatively short time she has been in the centre since crossing the Harbour Bridge Selina already has a gold star. For following her two wins in both singles events last year she now has five centre titles.

But in neither case were the two titles decided at the weekend easily won.

The Browns Bay veterans had to call on all of their experience and skill to win all three of their post-section matches. In the final they beat Takapuna's Brent Malcolm, Wynne Gray and Gordon Jenkins by just 16-14, and there were even closer calls in the quarter-final and semi-final.

Indeed, they were on the brink of defeat in the quarter-final against another Takapuna line -up of Bob Telfer, another distinguished veteran in Murray Mathieson, and the promising Sean Mulholland, who ironically has played most of his previous bowls at Browns Bay.

The Telfer-skipped triple, helped by some consistent draw bowls by Mulholland, looked to have won the game when it led by one with one end to play, only for Fisher with one of his last bowls to force a tie and an extra end.

And two immaculate draw bowls by Mathieson, who in a long career has four centre titles to his name, appeared to have again sealed the result, only for Fisher to play a near miraculous shot to steal the win.

In the semi-final against Helensville's talented Ricky Howe, Bart Robertson and Kylie Clarke Browns Bay only won by two shots, with Helensville almost forcing an extra end. That slim winning margin was then repeated in the final.

With the win Rogan now has a staggering 36 centre titles, Walker 27 and Fisher, who has played most of his bowls at Auckland's Howick club, seven. The trio have also had considerable success at national level.

It was, however, a fine effort for Malcolm, Gray, a one-time single figure golfer and one of the many former scribes now Takapuna members, and Jenkins to make the final for Gray and Jenkins are only two years out of juniors.

They had two comfortable wins in the quarter-finals against a Wayne Glogoski-skipped Mairangi Bay triple and in the semis against a strong Nigel Drewskipped Birkenhead. Helensville won its quarter-final over a Walter Howdenskipped Orewa.

Besides Selina's win, the women's singles also featured an emergence of some of the centre's younger talent. In particular, excellent performances came from Birkenhead's Millie Nathan, still a junior, and Mairangi Bay's gritty pair of Theresa Rogers and Colleen Rice.

Nathan lost the final 9-21 to Selina,

who by then had found her rhythm, but had the distinction of beating another gifted junior Skye Renes in the quarter-final and then in the semi-final, the redoubtable Wendy Jensen. This was a notable victory for after Wendy had reasserted herself after trailing 12-0 to peg the score back to 13-all Millie found another gear and rallied over the final few ends to win 21-13.

And as Selina, having come off a heavy diet of practising on slow greens preparing for the upcoming Commonwealth Games, struggled to readjust to the quicker pace of Mairangi Bay, both Colleen and Theresa pushed her hard in the quarter-finals and semi-finals. In both games Selina had to recover from what had been big deficits against resolute opponents.

Theresa, indeed, came to the clash with Selina, having eliminated in the quarter-finals, one of North Harbour's most accomplished women's players of the past decade, Orewa's Elaine McClintock.

#### **BPL15 Teams Locked and Loaded**

After arguably the most exciting Bowls Premier League (BPL) yet, the ten franchises have been quick to submit their squads for the second tournament of the year, scheduled to begin at Club Pine Rivers on May 23, 2022.

Defending champions Sydney Lions will head to Brisbane with an unchanged line-up, with Karen Murphy AM, BPL14 All Star team member Ben Twist and Aaron Wilson all returning as the franchise looks to win an unprecedented fifth title.

Following a run to the final at home on the Murray, the Moama Steamers have acquired the services of former Hawk and Lion and BPL14 MVP Aron Sherriff to replace Kevin Anderson, who will be Scotland bound to attend a wedding.

Sherriff will join Ryan Bester and Natasha Van Eldik at the Steamers, joining fellow finalists Brisbane Pirates in making a solitary change to their teams, with former New Zealand international Jo Edwards MNZM returning to the tournament to replace Ellen Falkner MBE.

Edwards was due to don the maroon shirt at the most recent edition of the event, but due to COVID-19 border restrictions, was unable to travel across the ditch to join Alex Marshall MBE and Chris Rosanes, who will both return to represent the home franchise for the event.

Perth Suns narrowly missed out on finals in February, but will secure a unique slice of BPL history in May by fielding two women within their contingent, with Kristina Krstic replacing Ray Pearse to join Dawn Hayman and Cody Packer.

Gold Coast Hawks were quick to find a replacement for Sherriff, with former tournament MVP Shannon McIlroy making a BPL comeback and accompanying Kelsey Cottrell and Nathan Rice.

Both Melbourne franchises remain unchanged, with Melbourne eXtreme boasting Carla Krizanic, Matt Flapper and Ali Forsyth, while Melbourne Pulse retain the services of Ellen Ryan, Barrie Lester and Gary Kelly.

Tweed Heads Ospreys will bring the same line-up that saw them conquer both BPL12 and BPL13, with Aaron Teys, Chloe Stewart and Corey Wedlock returning, while Adelaide Pioneers also selected an unchanged trio, of Scott Thulborn, Wayne Ruediger and Katelyn

Tasmania Tridents have also opted for the same line-up as Moama, with Rebecca Van Asch, Taelyn Male and Mark Nitz donning the state's colours for their second foray into the sport's made-for-television marquee tournament.

BPL15 is scheduled for May 23-27, 2022, with 24 hours of live broadcast on Fox Sports, Kayo and Sky Sports NZ across Tuesday to Friday evenings from 4pm-10pm AEST. See below for the full ins and outs for each BPL franchise (Kiwis in Bold):






