



History of Bowling on the North Shore

Reproduced from "A Bit of History & Celebrations Guide" marking the Club's 75th Jubilee in 2018. Originally published "Zooming in on the History of Bowls at the Birkenhead Men's Bowling Club 1943-89" Complied by Jack Gledhill. (taken from the North Shore, Sub-centre Report, 1972)

"Those who read our programme for last year's North Shore Open Fours Tournament will recollect we recounted the growth of our game on the Shore insofar as competition and inter-club play was concerned. This year we give you the story of the growth of clubs and the happy co-operation which exists between them. The first recorded association between clubs was around 1920, this being between Devonport (established in 1895). Waitemata (now Northcote, established 1900), Takapuna (1911) and Stanley (1920). Over the next two decades these four clubs enjoyed keen competition mainly through the Cadness Cup and Marine Pennants Competitions. Isolationism and lack of newly formed clubs somewhat restricted activities.

However, the advent of the 1940's saw an upsurge of interest in developing areas with the formation of clubs at Browns Bay (1943), Birkenhead (1944) and North Devonport (1945), with these additional clubs there was added interest in the Shore inter-club competitions. With more peaceful times prevailing, again another upsurge of interest came about with the formation of the Takapuna RSA Club in 1947, Mairangi Club in 1948 and the Bayswater Club in 1950.

Growth remained steady within the established clubs until we saw the foundation of what we refer to as our country clubs, namely Orewa (1951), Manly (1952) and Silverdale in 1957.

Further expansion of bowling on the Shore came about with the opening of the Harbour Bridge, when the Glenfield Club was established in 1958. To date, we have recorded 14 of our clubs – the 15th of our affiliated clubs is Kaukapakapa, which was established in 1928.

In the season 1964-65, this club decided to affiliate with the North Shore Bowling Subcentre because of its associations with its neighbouring clubs Orewa, Silverdale and Manly.

Since their establishment each of our clubs have either increased their playing areas or enlarged their clubhouses to accommodate new members. This steady growth is most encouraging. At present, the playing strength within the Sub-centre is 1694, an increase of 91 on the previous season.

But what of the future? At present, some of our clubs would gladly welcome new members and it is to be hoped that the "house full" sign will soon be displayed at these clubs. The statisticians and town planners tell us that within the next ten years or so we can expect the population on the Shore to double; obviously, this will lead to the establishment of more clubs to cater for many adherents of our game who will become flat-dwellers or residents in new, developing areas.

Few of the present clubs can expand their playing areas, therefore it is possible to see odd new clubs within the more populated districts; but the more spectacular growth is likely to come from places such as Beach Haven, Greenhithe, Milford, Forrest Hill and Albany areas.

With the growth and development expected, can we anticipate perhaps 24 clubs on the Shore by, say 1957?

With such a closely-knit group of clubs joined together by lack of transport to Auckland City in the early days, co-operation between the various clubs grew to the extent that under the guidance of the Sub-centre an annual "Wool Sale" meeting is still being held, when all clubs get together to arrange their mid-week and Sunday tournaments thereby avoiding clash-

ing of dates with their neighbouring clubs and also important dates it the Centre and Subcentre programmes.

This aspect of group co-operation is something which the Auckland Centre has commended and suggested that it could well be adopted by groups of clubs within the same areas of the City.

As further evidence of club co-operation, a grooving machine was purchased by the Subcentre to be used by the clubs for their annual green renovations.

In 1962, it was decided to buy a soil pulveriser, the cost of which was met by each of the clubs contributing seven pounds; this ensured the clubs of the right to have the full use of this equipment, while other bodies such as women's bowling clubs pay a hireage charge. Our thanks must go to Manning Bros, in particular Mr Frank Manning, a member of the Bayswater Club, who undertook to maintain the equipment and also keep a record of the bookings from the various clubs for some years.

The Sub-centre Executive was fully aware this was a labour of love and, therefore, were grateful to accept an offer from Browns Bay Club to house the equipment and arrange bookings.

In 1984 North Shore separated from the Auckland Centre becoming a full centre in its own right. Incorporated in the centre were 21 clubs with 2973 members, making it the 5th largest centre in NZ in 1988.







Official Draw for Birmingham 2022

Reproduced Bowls International 11 July 2022

Minister for Sport takes part in the official draw for Birmingham 2022 Lawn Bowls and Para Lawn Bowls competition

- Minister for Sport, Nigel Huddleston, carried out the official draw for the Commonwealth Games Lawn Bowls and Para Lawn Bowls competition
- 24 different nations and territories will compete with several home nation battles lined up for the early rounds of the competition
- The Lawn Bowls and Para Lawn Bowls tournament will be held at Victoria Park in Royal Leamington Spa from 29 July until 6 August
- Tickets currently available for all Lawn Bowls and Para Lawn Bowls sessions. Tickets cost £22 for adults and £8 for under 16s

The Minister for Sport, Nigel Huddleston, visited Victoria Park in Royal Leamington Spa on Thursday evening (7 July) to carry out the official draw for seven of the 11 medal events that make up the Lawn Bowls and Para Lawn Bowls competition at Birmingham 2022. The seedings for the competition are done based on the results from Gold Coast 2018 with any new teams that did not compete four years ago being added to the different sections (pools) through the draw process.

The draw was therefore carried out for the women's singles, the men's singles, the men's pairs, the women's triples, the men's fours, the Para men's pairs and the para women's pairs.

The eyes of some of the home nations will be firmly fixed on section B of the women's singles with Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland all drawn together and in the women's pairs there is a similar scenario in section C with Scotland, England and Northern Ireland all playing one another in the group stage.

Intriguing groups have also emerged in the men's triples and the men's fours with section D in the former featuring Canada, England, Malaysia and South Africa and section A of the latter featuring reigning champions Scotland, New Zealand, South Africa, Jersey and Malta.

All of the Para Lawn Bowls competitions will be round robin events with each team in

each of the three competitions playing one another.



Gary Smith, Chief Executive of World Bowls said: "With the draw now completed the stage is now set for the Commonwealth's best players to exhibit their high-class talents and to showcase our sport to a global audience. We are all looking forward to an exciting event in a superb setting at Victoria Park, Royal Leamington Spa."

Minister for the Commonwealth Games, Nigel Huddleston said: "Lawn bowls will be one of the hottest tickets for British fans at Birmingham 2022 with home nation teams drawn together across the medal events.

"Victoria Park is a stunning setting for the lawn bowls and Para lawn bowls and it's great to see how investment from the Commonwealth Games will leave a real legacy for this venue and the local community."

Matt Kidson, Director of Sport for Birmingham 2022, said: "It's great that the draw for Lawn Bowls and Para Lawn Bowls has now been completed. With the world's best players taking part, it's going to be an exciting competition and a really popular sport during the Games.

"Victoria Park is going to be a superb venue for the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games. Our temporary infrastructure is currently being installed and we can't wait for the teams to arrive to play in this fantastic setting."

The draw, which took place next to the bowling greens in Victoria Park, was also attended by Andrew Day, Warwick District Council Leader, who said: "It was fantastic to welcome the Minister of Sport to Victoria Park, who referred to the greens as the 'Wimbledon of lawn bowls!'

"It was an opportunity to show the tremendous amount of work that's gone in over the past few years to make this a world-class facility. With just three weeks to go until the Games it's all systems go and we're excited and ready to be welcoming the thousands of visitors and spectators over the summer."

Full details for all eleven medal events are now available at Birmingham 2022.com, where you can also take a look at the schedule and buy tickets for the competition which will get underway on Friday 29 July.
