



Thursday afternoon the news came through that Life Member Bub Pike had passed away peacefully, his beloved wife Val at his side. Just three days short of his ninety-second birthday, Harold Pike or "Bub" as most knew him had spent half his life as a member of

the Birkenhead Bowling Club. Bub had come from rugby league having played for Northcote Tigers which he continued to support right up to his passing. Bub joined Birkenhead Bowling Club initially as a social member and became a playing member in 1976 showing some promise in his initial season taking out the First Year Singles title. This was followed up the following year leading for Dall Millett's four to take out the Intermediate Fours Championship. A long wait between titles, twenty-six years in fact, when in 2005 the Veteran Singles went Bub's way. Bub's name may not be etched on the boards as many times as others, nevertheless he has been a very active playing member of the Club, on the greens at Birkenhead and at outside clubs. But titles alone didn't make the club member Bub was. Bub was one of life's gentlemen with not a bad word for anyone, could chat to anyone with time to listen, a well-respected member. A builder by trade Bub had a hand in many of the additions to the Club over the years always willing to help out. Awarded life Birkenhead Bowling Club Life Member Bub Pike membership mid 2000s Bub continued to



work tirelessly about the Club. Even after going into the home with his wife Val, Bub would still turn up on a Monday morning to help out where he could and catch up with the guys. Up until recently he was a regular Saturday morning, if not to play a game of pool but to watch and chat, have a wee punt on the machines and a half of old dark, before getting picked up by a family member, often a grandson. Following Bub's passing the accolades flowed on social media: "Bub you were a fine gentleman", "Great memories top bloke", "one of the most humble graceful souls", "A Gentleman with heart and wit", "he was a real gentleman", "such a beautiful soul", "amazing guy and loved by all, a great man", "a true friend and gentleman to everyone", "always had a smile and a kind word to share", "Another precious and loving angel chosen", "We lose another legend"....... Bub and Val's eldest grandson had the final word of the scheduled speakers, he spoke of

the warmth that Bub and Val emanated, a warmth that could definitely be felt throughout the room that day. Of the scheduled speakers where long-time family and Northcote Tigers friends Dave Lepper and Graeme Norton.

Allan Meekings Memorial **Entries Close Tomorrow, Played Saturday**





Tribute to Ross Haresnape

Ross Haresnape, much admired by North Harbour bowlers for his talent as a player and his judgement as a selector, has passed away, having battled ill heath for some time. Though the bulk of his extensive bowling career was with the Auckland centre, Ross made

a significant contribution to Harbour, both playing and selecting, for a decade or so from about 2004. He was in a group of top bowlers, headed by Rowan Brassey and Danny O'Connor, who switched to the Harbour centre because of a disagreement with the then Auckland centre administration. Their arrival provided Harbour with a boost in overall playing standards. Ross played firstly with Takapuna, helping that club win the national sevens interclub title in 2005, then more regularly with Birkenhead and Browns Bay.

In his relatively short time with North Harbour he made an immediate impact, winning 11 centre titles between 2006 and

2012 and so adding a bar to his gold star.

He, of course, won many other titles in Auckland and in a number of other centres and he won four national titles. The first of these was with the legendary Nick Unkovich in the pairs and the others in the fours with the likes of Brassey, O'Connor, Jamie Hill and Kerry Chapman. North Harbour's most decorated centre champion, Colin Rogan, played with him at club and Centre level and has fond memories of both the man and the bowler. He described him as one of the game's genuine characters who also enjoyed considerable success when acting as a centre selector.

"He could play some of the most amazing and you often were left thinking how in earth did he do that," Rogan said.

Bob Howitt, who was in the 2005 Takapuna national sevens side with Ross, is another who recalls him fondly and as a wonderful story-teller as well as fine bowler.

Bowls North Harbour and its clubs joins everyone in the New Zealand bowling community in offering Ross's family heartfelt condolences.

Ross's funeral is at 11am on Thursday, 1 September at Waikumete Chapel 2, followed by drinks afterwards at the Glen Eden Bowling Club.




