Bowls North Harbour Club of the Year

Excellence, Administrator, Club Person

It's been an off season like no other for Birkenhead's Terry Moverley. Not having to deal with the Covid issues of the past two years and the Club open without disruption Moverley has been busy. In past years the Bee Express has gone into hibernation for winter, but with the evolution of the Darts Section the Bee Express has continued to go to print each Wednesday morning, couple that with the AGM and BoM duties there has been no let up. This continued dedication to the Club was recognised and honoured over the past three months with a number of awards.

Firstly, Moverley was recognised for his long and outstanding service to the Birkenhead Bowling Club being award a "Club Excellence Award" at AGM 2022. Two weeks later he received the "Bowls North Harbour Administrator of the Year Award", for the third time in the past four years. Then to top it all off, at Bowls New Zealand's Awards Dinner last Friday evening in Dunedin, Moverley was announced the winner of "Bowls New Zealand – 2022 Club Person of the Year", for the outstanding contribution that he has made to his Birkenhead Bowling Club and local community. It certainly was a case of third time lucky having been named a finalist in 2019 and 2020. As it turned out Moverley's Award was the only award to go the way of the North Island with the rest all going to the South. Speaking after the Awards Moverley said "to be recognised by your Club is appreciative, but to be recognised for my efforts by my Club, the Centre and then Bowls New Zealand, now that is truly humbling, only wish my Dad (Garry Moverley) could have been here to see it."

Moverley is currently having a week off and is today relaxing overlooking Curio Bay and gazing out into the Southern Ocean on Southland's Catlins Coast.

The Birkenhead Bowling Club was also nominated for "Club of the Year", but that title went to Dunedin's Taieri Bowling Club.





Terry Moverley: Club Person of the Year 2022

If every bowling club in New Zealand had a 'Terry Moverley', then bowls would be in an even more fantabulous state of affairs throughout the country.

Sure. Many bowling clubs do have a 'Terry Moverley'. And maybe even a better "Terry Moverley' than the actual Terry Moverley at the lucky Bowls Birkenhead club on Auckland's North Shore. But they're not easy to come by. So it's no surprise that Terry Moverley, the <u>real</u> Terry Moverley, has been named Bowls New Zealand's Club Person of the Year in 2022.

Terry is a true club man. He's a bloke that doesn't just talk the talk (and Terry isn't short of a word or three), but walks the walk as well. They say that if you want something done, ask a busy person. Well, Terry's a busy person ... but you don't need to ask him. Invariably, you'll find he's already doing it.

"That can cause a bit of strife at home," laughs Terry. "My wife Emmie is Chairperson of the club, so sometimes we don't see things the same way!"

But they're both determined to make Bowls Birkenhead the best.

"Our full-playing bowling club membership is around 100," says Terry. "But including our social membership it is over the 340 mark. The locals tend to see us as their community club in Birkenhead, rather than just a bowling club for a private membership. They see themselves, and the club, as being part of their home in Birkenhead, not just another anonymous club in the metropolitan sprawl of Auckland."

"As a result, we have lots of non-bowling people and non-bowling organisations using our club rooms. Like the Calliope Athletic and Harrier Club who meet here every Wednesday evening for a run. And the Birkenhead Volunteer Fire Brigade ... many of whom pop in on a Fridy evening for a beer and a yarn."

"U3A (University of the Third Age) uses us. And darts have become a big thing at the club."

"But one of the uses of the club we're most proud of is 'BeezKnits' ... we act as the collection point for locals, including our own ladies, who knit booties, hats, mittens, and vests for premature babies born at Middlemore Hospital."

But Terry is always on the lookout for more. The club facility's there to be used and he's keen to see it used to the full.

But all this usage Terry encourages is just the tip of the iceberg of his work for Birkenhead. Officially, Terry is Secretary of Bowls Birkenhead ... a role which he performs with seeming ease, But when you get Terry, the secretary, you also get Terry, the superadministrator ... an 'ubermensch' with a heck of a lot more organisational and marketing

skills than simply the secretarial skills required for a bowling club.

He's been creating and publishing the club newsletter 'Bee Express' since 2014. A new issue gets emailed to hundreds of members and friends of the club every week. He complements this regular communication with flyers he produces to publicize upcoming tournaments at the club. And for the big tournaments, he produces and sends invitations to potential participants.

At the same time, Terry looks after the club's website and facebook pages. No. 'Looks after' undervalues what he actually does ... both the website and facebook page are always up to date with a rich assortment of content. Terry doesn't seem to get 'posting fatigue'.

He's even set up a loyalty system 'BeeRewards' to encourage people to use the club more.

Funnily enough, Terry doesn't regard all this marketing stuff as his real forte. "I like organising events," he says. "Particularly bowls events like the elite Men's Open here in February every year, and the Women's Open Two-Day Pairs."

"I also have a hand in the organisation of the Easter and end-of-season May tournaments."

However, It's not just bowling tournament tournaments which Terry organises. He's a sports nut. So whenever there's a big sporting occasion, and the timing's right, he'll organise a breakfast get-together at the club to watch it on the big screen.

The list goes on. But not just the fun stuff. Terry initiated the creation of the club's policy for the prevention of harassment, bullying and discrimination. Along with the club's transgender policy. He didn't have to fight off a lot of takers for these jobs!

And if those tasks weren't drier than a summer in the Maniototo, he also became the club's 'expert' on the current COVID regulations.

It's difficult to imagine anything that Terry doesn't do at Birkenhead (but there is more. Much more). And difficult to imagine how anyone else in the country could've dome much more to beat him to the award of Club Person of the Year in 2022. Well deserved Terry. Congratulations.

South Reign Supreme in South Island Showdown

In the barest of margins, somewhat decided by a tie-break finish, the South have taken out the ultimate Island Supremacy, holding tough to win the inaugural honours in spectacular fashion. In a competition that came down to the wire, the eagerly anticipated North vs South encounter held at the Hopes Dunedin Lawn Bowls Stadium proved to be a memorable showcase, featuring the country's best talent and playing host to many fantastic performances across the "big blue" carpet.

Though after 16 games, it was the South that emerged victorious, successfully retaining their overnight leaders' status and holding the North at arm's length throughout day two ... right to the final bowl. Continuing their winning ways early doors, the South combinations wrapped up three of the four mixed pairs fixtures, with only Leanne Poulson and Mark Noble registering a win for the North opposite Pam Walker and Jonty Horwell in straight sets, 9-5, 8-5.

Other results saw the pairings of Tayla Bruce and Kelvin Scott, Sarah Scott and Mike Kernaghan and Val Smith and Andrew Kelly defeat their Northern counterparts, stretching the competition lead to 14-8.

However, with two fours' fixtures left to conclude the event and a possible eight points on the line for the North, it was game on and a sure-fire time to lift the intensity.

An impressive line-up of Mark Noble, Seamus Curtin, Nicole Toomey and Linda Ralph proved too strong for Mike Kernaghan and his charges Val Smith, Pam Walker and Jonty Horwell – with Noble and Co taking the game in straight sets and sending all eyes to the tie-breaker finish on the adjacent rink.

With one set apiece, the result of the event lay firmly with the tie-break winner between Andrew Kelly, Kelvin Scott, Sarah Scott and Tayla Bruce and Mike Galloway, Tony Grantham, Leanne Poulson and Selina Goddard – with Kelly and team holding strong for the overall win and sending the inaugural spoils the way of the South.

In closing, South's non-playing captain and selector Dave Edwards was full of praise for his team, simply pointing out his only instruction for the side prior to the weekend's play was to "have fun". "Well done guys, what a fantastic effort.

You all looked like you were having plenty of laughs out there and playing with a smile on your face . . . and that's what this is all about," Edwards said. "To the North, there was some epic games out there, well done guys.

To the stadium team, umpires, kitchen staff, bar staff, Bowls New Zealand and the teams themselves, thanks for putting on such a great event for us all . . . we've really bought into it big time and it's been great." The North vs South showdown will return to the calendar next year, with a proposed venue to be Bowls Hastings.




