

Interclub wrap-up Birkenhead Women

I almost gave our irregular commentator Mike Cartwright a call to talk to him about writing the summary from the last two weekends, but I feel like I have pissed enough people off over the past weekend if you were currently watching Facebook like TV. So in my own words which in no way resembles the club's opinion, here is what happened - the drama and the intrigue and then the fall-out.

The Birkenhead Women's side for Interclub 2022-23 season by all accounts would be one of the "unlikely winner" category that we have fielded since the women arrived at Birkenhead over 10 years ago. Having said that, what we may have lacked in numbers - we just scraped together a side (on the Thursday), didn't lack for belief in ourselves that we could do better than our failure to launch in 2021. Milly, Loz, Connie, Jamie and myself were the key players, and then 2 of our 1-5 girls, LJ and Fay, both in their infant bowling careers but no less gutsy. Fay was only available one of the days on the first weekend, so Bett was our spare player for the Sunday.

Millie, playing the singles and myself and Connie in the pairs, left Jamie, out of her usual position to skip Loz and the two girls off the front. Luckily, it was expected that both the pairs and singles would give us a fair start and perhaps keep us in the tournament till the last day. As recorded, both the teams won their respective 6 from 6 games over the tournament to get us to the last game. The fours, did what we hoped they would do, win the odd game here and there and be close wherever possible. The girls held together for the 6 games very well with some very classy bowls from all the the team at times during the weekend.

And then came the game which really was the final - game 7 against the Takapuna reigning champions and National interclub winners. It was noted while it wasn't their team that won that final however, no less than an international in Selina playing singles, Adele and Robyne in the pairs (Adele is an ex-Birkenhead member) and then former international Wendy Jensen skipping current BNH rep players in Trish Hardy, Keiko Kurihara and Lauren Mills. Formidable opposition for any 1-5 player.

The club selectors decided to use the Conditions of Play to our full advantage and swap our team around to ensure we were going to give ourselves the best chance of knocking off the team 2-1. The points going into the last round - just 1 point - 1/2 a game separated the two teams. We submitted our team sheet prior to the commencement of the round and notified the appropriate persons that we were making a change and then proceed to the 12pm start time.

LJ - our very gutsy 1-5 player was nominated to play the singles as a sacrificial lamb (poor girl), no change to the pairs and Millie went to skip in the fours, Loz at 3, Fay at 2 and Jamie to her natural position of lead.

And that's when the controversy started. Stepping onto the green with every intention to play at 12pm, Takapuna (according to the FB article), immediately switched their team to counter our changes. In our mind, perhaps after the 12pm start and with no team sheet filled in, but nonetheless they got permission to do so and then it became game-on. LJ did an admirable job against Adele in the singles, up 7-0 before the game got interesting. Very brave and more aware of what the big time looks like. The pairs, well unfortunately went down to a very on fire Selina, who played outstanding (as she also did on the Sunday for the rep team). The Birkenhead fours were a stand-out - Millie and Loz played every shot in the book, and drew every bowl with some great performances from Jamie and Fay. Very proud of them for that and getting the win. Congratulations Takapuna for being the winners.

Browns Bay in its win was also anchored by a core of vastly experienced players in multiple centre champions, and past national titleholders in Colin Rogan, John Walker, Neil Fisher and Brian Wilson.

In the guarter-finals it ousted the always dangerous Helensville, and in the semi-final Riverhead 9-0.

Takapuna whitewashed Milford in its guarter-final, then beat Mairangi Bay in the semifinal, the latter having beaten another of the favoured clubs, Birkenhead, in the quarter-

Browns Bay continued its dominance in the final over Takapuna, with Rogan winning the singles and then Wilson and Mulholland clinched the match by winning the pairs.

Summerset National Singles & Pairs: North Harbour/Auckland, 2nd-9th January Summerset National Fours & Mixed Pairs: Central Otago, 23rd Feb-2nd March Bowls New Zealand moved towards an online event management system for National Events in the 2021-2022 season, called BowlsHub Aotearoa.

This system was a great success and is therefore being retained for the 2022-2023. **This means:**

- 1. Every member entering a National Event in the 2022-2023 season will need to have a profile with BowlsHub Aotearoa (If you entered a national event last season, you will already have a profile).
 - If haven't registered yet, this can be done by going to bowlshub.co.nz/signup,Once you've created an account you can log in to BowlsHub Aotearoa at www.bowlshub.co.nz (take note of your National ID/Membership number once you've logged in.)
- 2. Entering a National Event for the 2022-2023 season is done on BowlsHub Aotearoa.
- 3. Once you've logged into BowlsHub Aotearoa navigate to "My Competitions" and you will be able enter the 2023 Summerset Nationals.
- 4. If you're entering a pairs or fours event you will need to know the National ID/ Membership Number of every member in your team.
