

Opposition in Awe

Thirty-two teams walked out on the greens at Birkenhead last Saturday morning. Sunday

afternoon only two teams remained in the Champions Cup draw, both hadn't lost a game all weekend, seven wins each up until the final. Fourteen ends and a formidable opposition stood in front of both teams for the \$1,500 pay day and the Champions Cup Helensville's Bart Robertson off the front for Pt Chev's Steve Hoeft while Takapuna's Jerry Belcher lead for Birkenhead's Tony Grantham

Robertson and Hoeft took initial control, up after three ends to lead by five (5-0). Belcher and Grantham got on the board when end four was counted up (5-2). The game remained tight with only a few shots separating the teams on the score board but Hoeft maintained the lead (9-6) after nine ends played. Tenth end four shots to Grantham then the eleventh end three shots, Grantham held a four shot lead (9-13). Hoeft pulled within one shot picking up three on the twelfth to be one behind (12-13). The thirteenth end and a one to Grantham (12-14). The fourteenth and final end went to Hoeft with a single shot, but it was not enough to force the extra end or a win. The win went to Belcher and Grantham (13-14). The third time Grantham had savoured victory in this event while it was Belchers first. Grantham was the standout play of the tournament playing some superb under pressure shots across the whole two days leaving the opposition in awe.

14th Annual Women's Pairs

Under the Presidency of Rod Mahon the men of Birkenhead voted to allow women full membership of the club. Emmie Swart and Leanne Chinery were the first women to sign up and set out to put Birkenhead on the map of women's bowls and announce that the women had arrived. Thus, the Women's Open Pairs Tournament with its big money and high class was born. The initial tournament, organised in a short period of time, with prize money of \$4,300, was an overwhelming success. In 2013 and in its fourth year with "Slipp Inn" sponsoring for the third consecutive year and prize money was \$6,500. 2014 the tournament reached its fifth year and to celebrate the prize money was raised to \$7,000. 2015 and 2016 saw the tournament full early again with several teams in reserve. 2017 the weather intervened and unlike 2013 the 2017 tournament was forced to be abandoned. 2018 saw the \$6,500 Women's Invitation Pairs successfully played out on the greens at Birkenhead with Natasha Grimshaw and Gaylene Harvey (s) taking out the top prize of \$1,500. 2019 saw the tournament move forward to a new date slot in mid-February and endorsed by Bowls New Zealand as part of the Summer of Bowls. A number of current New Zealand Blackjacks swelled the field, but it was Trish Croot and Lisa White that came through to shine and be crowned tournament winners for 2019.

The 2020 tournament had the pleasure of Australian bowling legend Karen Murphy in the field. Karen selected Mairangi Bay's Colleen Rice, from the coaching clinics held over the few days prior, to partner up with Karen. The pair made it through to the final only to come runner-up to Kensington's Anne Muir and Mangawhai's Sue Wightman. Wightman and Muir return from the winterless north and first hit out is against Mercury bay's Lee McDonald and Colleen Sexton, possibly the game of the first round.

2021 the raiders from the south, Waikiki's Lynda Milne (skip) and Alexandra's Linley O'Callaghan stole the show defeating Birkenhead's Trish Croot and Ruth Lynch in the final.

Locals from the Takapuna club, Trish Hardy. Wendy Jenson (s) claimed the 2022 title. 2023 sees the 14th Women's Pairs over the weekend 11 -12 February, when a field of thirty teams will assemble. The lead half of the 2022 Cup Championship pair Trish Hardy returns but skip Wendy Jensen is absent from this year's field. Hardy has a suitable replacement with Hinuera's Deb White making a tournament comeback. Hardy and White kick of their campaign against Carlton Cornwell's Jeanine Browne and Bridge Parks' Rhonda Thompson. 2021 Champions Te Rangi's Lynda Milne and Alexandra's Linely O'Callaghan return from the deep south to a first round clash against Takapuna's Jacqui Belcher and Birkenhead's excitable AB support Loz Croot.

The all-Birkenhead pair of Milly Nathan and Connie Mathieson should go deep into this event but with a first-round clash against Kensington's Patricia Murray and Sue Rokstad followed by a second round against Mairangi Bay's Sheryl Wellington and Theresa Rogers, could test the Birkenhead pair.

Favoured Birkenhead combo of Trish Croot and Colleen Rice strike two Kensington teams in the first two rounds, Diane Strawbridge and Dawn Owens followed by Janice Little and Diane Klomp. The third game gets no easier for Croot and Mathieson as they take on recently selected Blackjack Leeane Poulson and Papakura clubmate Cheryl Hunia. Recent Queenstown regular Margaret O'Connor hasn't made the trip north this year although Christine Buchanan will be waving the Queenstown flag, teamed up with Takapuna's National Pairs Runner-up Robyne Walker. Buchanan and Walker strike mother and daughter pair of Parkland's Stephanie Pascoe and Pt Chev's Jenny Te Nana, Te Nana knows this tournament backwards having played in everyone.

Ruth Lynch once a king pin amongst the women at Birkenhead migrated to the Bay and Omokoroa in particular. This year Lynch is teamed up with daughter Rachelle Morrison both under the Omokoroa Club.

Lynch and Morrison's first round game could have been played in the Bay as they take on Tauranga Domain's Gayle Melrose and Mary Campbell. Melrose and Campbell should be well warmed by the time they meet Helensville's Joy Connell and Jeni Hart in the second. Royal Oak's Claire Tawharu has joined up with Takapuna's Judy Farkash, an untried pairing that could surprise with the draw given on day one.

Bowls On the International Stage in 2023

The 2022 year provided a significant highlight for the sport on the international bowls calendar, with the successful staging of the Commonwealth Games at the Victoria Park bowling greens in Leamington Spa, Birmingham, England.

Twenty-four World Bowls Commonwealth Games members were in attendance, featuring a total of 227 (118 men and 109 women) athletes in a scintillating promotion for the sport, which ultimately demonstrated that bowls was a sport enjoyed by young and old, ablebodied and para players, and participants from varied backgrounds and walks of life, after a very quiet preceding two years of international bowls competition.

The sport will continue to take centre stage with a global focus in 2023, with the sport's other marquee competition, the World Bowls Championships, staged for the first time in a successive year following a Commonwealth Games.

A new international-calibre event will take place for the first time, with the staging of the inaugural Oceania Bowls Challenge scheduled to occur in Auckland, New Zealand in April, and in May the World Indoor Bowls Championships will be contested at Warilla in NSW,

The Warilla Bowls and Recreation Club has been a long-term hosting partner of World Bowls, having been the proud home of the now-obsolete World Cup event on many occasions, and contains a superb seven-rink indoor green and three outdoor greens.

The semi-finals and finals of the World Indoor Bowls Championships will be live streamed by Bowls Australia on behalf of World Bowls on May 11 and 12.

From August 29 to September 10, the 12-day World Bowls Championship will be staged at five clubs across the Gold Coast, Australia, including Broadbeach, Club Helensvale, Club Musgrave, Mudgeeraba and Paradise Point, with an open-entry to all World Bowls member nations for the first time, removing previous qualifying requirements, and three Para disciplines dramatically increasing the number of participants, ensuring the sport's best bowlers from every bowls nation will be in attendance.

Bowls Australia will be providing live-streaming coverage across the preliminary sessions and producing broadcast coverage all gold medal finals matches.

To round out an action-packed year, in November, Bowls New Zealand and the Naenae Bowls Club in Wellington, New Zealand will host another edition of the World Champions of Champions event, with Bowls New Zealand again providing live-streaming of the final two days of finals.

The 2023 Junior World Championships will also be held towards the end of the year, with the host venue and dates still to be confirmed.

2023 World Bowls Indoor Championships' Fields Confirmed

A star-studded list of competitors will descend on Warilla, NSW, Australia for the sport's next international event, the 2023 World Bowls Indoor Championships.

Host club, Warilla Bowls and Recreation Club and Bowls Australia are collaborating with World Bowls and the International Indoor Bowls Council to bring this international event to life for just the second staging ever, with an unquestionably strong line-up of competitors. Extensive planning is presently underway for the eagerly anticipated event, which will see athletes from 35 nations competing; 33 men and 29 women will be motivated to win the coveted world titles.

Competing in this year's event is Daniel Salmon, Wales' back-to-back Commonwealth Games men's pairs gold medallist, while Norfolk Island's 24-year-old Shae Wilson will attempt to claim the women's crown.

Pundits will look to home-nation heroes Aron Sherriff and Kelsey Cottrell as the pretournament favourites, with the duo set to have a target planted firmly on their backs from the remainder of the field.

The most recent competition which has rebranded to the inaugural World Bowls Indoor Championships previously named 'World Cup', was held in 2022 in Bristol, England and was won by Scotland's champions Michael Stepney and Julie Forrest.

A sizable Australian audience of spectators is anticipated to attend, while digital coverage is planned to deliver the finals action across the last two days of the competition, with live-streaming on World Bowls' Facebook page.
