Cape Takes Singles

Saturday saw ten 1–5-year men turn out for the rescheduled 1-5 Year Championship Men's Singles. Bookies favourites BNH 1-5 Rep William Tonga, talented all-rounder Mitch Cameron and Club new-comer Nick Cape where there as were the first years Bill Robertson, Zakk Johnson and Craig Moverley and Mark Van Echten. Dennis English, Kieran Jones and Syd Walker filled out the field.

After day one, played under the two-life system, five remained, Cape the only two lifer, with Cameron, Moverley, Tonga and Jones on one life.

Sunday Cape sat out the first round with a bye, Jones defaulted gifting Tonga the win leaving Cameron and Moverley to play. Moverley jumped out to a surprise lead after four ends (6-0). But once Cameron settled and found his line he pegged back Moverley and passed him, ultimately taking a comfortable win (21-8). Cameron sat the next round out with the bye while Cape and Tonga battled it out. What started off as a tight game after nine ends it was all locked up (8-8). But at that point Cape stepped out to take eleven unanswered shots (19-8). Tonga came back with eight shots over six ends to be three behind (19-16). Two ends later and two shots to Cape (21-16), Tonga was on his way home while Cape progressed to a potential final with his two lives intact.

Cape and Cameron lined up, Cameron had to beat Cape twice while Cape only had to hold his composure and play the steady bowls he had been playing throughout on the championship for the win.

Cameron got out of the gates well and found himself leading (4-0), but after seven ends it was all locked up (5-5). Cape's steady line and weight control shone through comfortably taking the win (21-8) and the Club 1-5 Year Championship Men's Singles title. Next stop BNH 1-5 Year Men's Singles Champ of Champ..


Takapuna club member Skye Renes achieved the rare, remarkable feat of a centre open singles title at the weekend while still only a junior.

In The Grove Orewa BNH women's championship final at Mairangi Bay Skye beat another

bright prospect, Birkenhead's Millie Nathan, 21-17. But on an adjacent rink there was still satisfaction for the Birkenhead club for almost at the same time as the singles finished David Eades skipped Nigel Drew and Mark Rumble to a tense 19-18 win in the Dick Bree championship triples.

The Birkenhead triple beat a gallant Roy Parker-skipped Beach Haven line-up in a match evenly contested all the way and one which could have gone to an extra end but for a tight umpire's measure giving Beach Haven just one shot on the 18th end.

Skye's deserved win capped what has been an impressive record while still in the one-to-five ranks. Besides her many junior successes she already has two open titles, the champion of champion fours in 2020-21 and the championship triples last season. Though Millie won the first three ends to be ahead 3-0 it was Skye who was the more dominant player in the early stages. By often gaining the



The format is quite unique: every player has a card and records the outcome of the game. Four games of eight ends were played – three bowl pairs, 2-4-2, 2 bowl triples and three bowl triples. The players change for every game, so you don't stay in the same team. Scoring is based on points won and ends won are only used if there is a tie. Bonus points are applied with 4 points for a win and two points for a draw. The tournament provides for prizes for the top five points winners and a consolation prize for the person with the lowest points.

Winner was Don Martin with 56 points, second was John Croy with 50 points, 3 rd place went to Kieran Jones with 49 points, in 4 th place was Mike Pugh with 47 points and 5 th place went to Barry Reyland with 46 points. The consolation prize went to Bill Robertson with 20 points. Bob Murphy did his best to win the consolation prize, also ending up with 20 points but had three losses and a draw against Bill Robertson's three losses and a win. Many thanks to all those who turned up to play and I hope we can do it all again next year.



World Bowls Oceania Region Welcomes a New Event to the Calendar

World Bowls in partnership with Bowls New Zealand are extremely excited to launch the 2023 Digicel Oceania Challenge which will be a four-day tournament commencing on Friday April 14th and concluding on Monday April 17th to be staged at the Blockhouse Bay Bowling Club in Tamaki Makaurau Auckland, Aotearoa New Zealand.

The Digicel Oceania Challenge will for the first time ever bring together 10 international bowls teams from Aotearoa Maori, New Zealand Under 26, Tonga, Fiji, Niue, Tokelau, Samoa, Cook Islands, Papua New Guinea, and Norfolk Island. Aotearoa Maori and Tokelau are making their debuts at this level which is exciting for the players and their communities.

Regional Director Oceania for World Bowls, Brett O'Riley said the event will be a festival that will showcase Maori and Pacific cultures. Players will represent their island nations of origin, some resident in those islands, many residents in Aotearoa New Zealand and Australia as part of the diaspora in both countries.

"It will be a true celebration of the cultures that make up our Oceania region, with players of all ages from teenagers through to some over 50 years of age, including some amazingly talented players who already have impressive records", said Mr O'Riley.

Each day's play will feature two sessions of qualifying, with the top teams progressing to the gold medal matches on the final day. Teams will be comprised of five men and five women, who will compete in all disciplines of bowls, including singles, pairs, triples, and fours. This will be the first ever International Bowls' tournament for many of the participating players and countries. There will also be an overall Digicel Trophy for the most successful combined result across the four disciplines.

The Digicel Oceania Challenge will be an exciting opportunity for these countries to come together and compete on a world stage and promote and develop the sport of Bowls in the Oceania region.

Bowls NZ CEO Mark Cameron said it is a chance to highlight the growth of participation in the local game by Maori and Pacific players, in the world's largest Polynesian city, Tamaki Makaurau Auckland.

"We are delighted to see the level of participation and interest from our local communities and diaspora, and Bowls Auckland are playing a huge part in the hosting of the event, which will hopefully stimulate further interest in our sport. We look forward to standing with mana whenua to welcome the visiting teams", said Mr Cameron.

The competition will be a great opportunity for all players to prepare for the World Championships to be played on the Gold Coast, Australia from August 29th – September 10th 2023.





- Purpose: We believe that every child with Down syndrome should have the tools to develop their communication, confidence and independence, and the right to participate fully in society.
- Mission: We're empowering kids with Down syndrome to talk, read and write by helping fund speech language therapy
- Vision: Giving a voice to kids with Down syndrome

In New Zealand, a baby is born with Down syndrome is born every week on average. That's about 1 in 1,000 Kiwi families.

It is well-documented that "Speech and language therapy is the most important part of intervention services for children with Down syndrome if we wish to promote their cognitive (mental) and social development" (Buckley and Le Prevost, 2002). However, it may come as a surprise that the specialist education needed to ensure children with Down syndrome are equipped with the effective communication skills is not provided as part of the New Zealand Government's education curriculum. It is only available through private practitioners.

In 2003, a group of parents of kids with Down syndrome sought to address this need by establishing the UpsideDowns Education Trust. By helping fund speech and language therapy, we've ensured hundreds of kids have received tens of thousands of life-changing sessions and developed the ability to communicate effectively. The charity remains led by a volunteer Trust Board comprised predominantly of parents of children with Down syndrome


