Life Members to First Years

Seventeen applicants are now confirmed for the AGM 2023 Elections with two applicants vying for the Presidency and a staggering fourteen standing for one of the five Board Member positions available.

A late run of applications received before the 5pm deadline Saturday means candidates are standing for all available positions on the Board of Management. There are a total of nine elected positions on the Birkenhead Bowling Club Board of Management. These include the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and five Board Members. The position of Chairperson will be decided by the new Board, Emmie Swart has held this position eight terms (2014-17, 2018-23) and Colin Barrow one term (2017-18). Applications have been received from across the spectrum of playing members, from three life members to five first years and a further nine in between.

Life members Keith Burgess, Sandy Cleghorn and Emmie Swart have all put a tremendous amount of time and effort in to the Club over many years and continue to do so, all three are standing at AGM 2023. Sandy was recently honoured with the Club's Seafood Tournament this past season being renamed in his honour, "Sandy's Seafood Tournament". Both Keith and Sandy are running for the Board while Emmie's first option is that of Treasurer (she has past Treasurer Mavis Smith and fellow club member retired accountant Bill Hansen on-board to assist her), followed by Board Member.

First Years Zakk Johnson, Debbie Jones, Raymond Munce, Chris Thomas have all thrown their hats in for positions on the Board, while fellow first year Elaine Utting will be out to retain the Treasurers position. Long standing Secretary Terry Moverley, BNH Administrator of the Year (3x) and Bowls NZ Club Person of the Year, has competition for the position of Secretary from Bev Rolfe, who also has her name in for the Board.

The race for President sees past president John Croy (2017-20) up against past president Greg Utting (2011-14, 2016-17), Greg is also hedging his bets also going for a position on the Board if unsuccessful in his bid to become President. While the Vice President's position pitches John Croy up against current Vice President Douglas Campbell.

Rounding out the Board Member applications are Lauranne Croot, Curtis Ennor and Vaughan Henderson. The Club goes to the polls 10am Sunday 18 June 2023.



BBNH General Conditions of Play.

The general conditions of play for all Bowls North Harbour competitions have been updated and can be found on the BNH website under the "Events" tab. These apply to all events and are read in conjunction with the "Special Conditions of Play" that are published in each competition's conditions of play.

Laws of Bowls updates.

The World Bowls Board, following a recommendation from the World Bowls Laws Advisory Group, have agreed to rescind Laws 37.1.3 and Laws 37.1.5.3 with immediate

The changes to the Laws are summarised as follows:

If a bowl in its original course is deliberately displaced or stopped by a member of the team that delivered the bowl, the defaulting team will forfeit the game to their opponent. Displacement of a bowl at rest

If a bowl in motion is displaced by a player and it has not disturbed the head after it is displaced, the opposing skip or the opponent in Singles must choose whether to: place the bowl where the player believes it would have come to rest; or declare the end dead.

If a bowl in motion is displaced by a player and it has disturbed the head after it is displaced, the opposing skip or the opponent in Singles must choose whether to: place the bowl where the player believes it would have come to rest and replace any part of the head disturbed after the displacement; or declare the end dead.

If a bowl at rest or a toucher in the ditch is displaced by a player and it has not disturbed the head after it is displaced, the opponent must put the bowl back to its former position. If a bowl at rest or a toucher in the ditch is displaced by a player and it has disturbed the head after it is displaced, the opponent must put the bowl back to its former position and replace any part of the head disturbed after the displacement.

If a player lifts a bowl at rest on their rink to allow their team's bowl in its original course to pass, the defaulting team will forfeit the game to their opponent..
