

In 2012 a big money men's pairs tournament was staged at Birkenhead with total prize money of \$5,000 of which \$1,500 went to first place. Tony Grantham donated a cup "The Champions Cup". Stuie Moorcroft put on a magnificent morning tea and lunch. The tournament was full over a month out. Teams came from the as far away as Far North, Waikato, and Bay of Plenty. After two days of highly competitive play Neville and Jamie Hill came out the champions.

After five years the tournament has never looked back and grows each year. The tournament continues to fill early and contin-

ues to evolve to the needs of the bowlers, our tournament partner and our club. It has continued to attract top bowlers from within our region and beyond. In recent years and including this year we have had players from Australia. The fields have always been strong, with each year getting stronger. President Keith Burgess said "the field for this year would be the strongest yet and to pick a winner is not an easy one and narrowed it down to six teams".

Last year's winners Birkenhead's Tony Grantham and Eastbourne's Justin Goodwin are aiming to be the first team

Star bowler Kerry Chapman makes his first appearance at the tournament paired up with fellow first timer Dwayne Cameron, a formidable pairing and sure to create some exciting play over the two days.

2015 New Zealand National Pairs Champions Petar Sain and Rob Ashton are set ruffle a few feathers. Birkenhead's Allan Stewart pairs up with past club mate and current New Zealand Open Pairs winner Central Cambridge's Jessie Russell. Birkenhead's very own ten times National title holder Danny O'Connor returns with Hillsboro's Peter Thorne giving a hand.

Neighbouring Club Glenfield fields four teams Brian Nolan/Gary Helmling, Mick Moodie/Jimmy Gifford, Doug Campbell/Bruce Baker and Terry and Tommy Campbell. While Northcote has Mike Haggart and former Mr New Zealand Kenny Moran, in different teams, waving their flag.

Birkenhead's current club pairs champions Evan Thomas and Doug Parlane have only played together this season and are a team just starting to gel and could go far. Nigel Drew with the ever consistent Mark Rumbel off the front. Make up the only two full Birkenhead teams in the field.

Otahuhu Railway's Mark Hall makes his first appearance accompanied by club mate Joe Whitelaw hoping to steam through the field and not become a train wreck.

Those making the trek south from the winterless north are Steve Smith, Dusty Reader, Ken Fitness, John Dunn, Eric Pattillo, Sam Nelson and David Hood.

Birkenhead's President Keith Burgess having played each year has this year snared Riverhead's Bart Robinson in the hope of getting some of the \$5,500 prize pool.

Riverhead's Steve Cox and Grant Goodwin the most consistent placing team each year just haven't been able to claim the top prize, this year could be theirs but there are some tough teams to get past first. It all starts 8.15am this Sunday morning culminating in five finals being played on the top green Monday afternoon at 3.15pm.


