Past Birkenhead member Leanne Chinery's Canadian fours team finished just outside the medals in the Women's Fours last week on the Gold Coast. This week it was all pairs and after losing first up to Norfolk Island (14-12), beating Fiji (30-7), New Zealand (18-16) and Tonga (20-12), finished section play top of the section. Quarter finals and a reverse of the section play result, beating Norfolk Island (21-6). Semi-finals and a win over Malaysia would guarantee them either silver or gold, but that wasn't to be going down (8-15). Into the playoff for the bronze against Scotland, but a case of "déjà vu" from the fours going down (18-10) and finishing in fourth, just outside the medals. Malaysia won the gold over South Africa (15-14)

This was Leanne's third Commonwealth games campaign and having in the past never got past the quarter finals. A fourth place in the Women's Fours, which she skipped, and a fourth place in the Women's Pairs, which she lead, is a nice achievement.

After toping their section Birkenhead's Mike Nagy accompanied by Paul Girdler, Blake Signal and Ali Forsyth representing New Zealand in the Men's Fours came up against England in the quarter finals. Unfortunately that's were Mike's and his team mates hopes of a medal ended. New Zealand went down to England (2-20) and out of the competition. We now look forward, what do Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games hold?

Extract from The Birkenhead Bowling Club Incorporated Constitution

6.4 Resignation of Membership

- (a) A Member (other than a Casual Member) may resign his/her membership of the Club by giving not less than thirty (30) days notice of such resignation. Upon receipt of such notice of resignation, the Secretary shall inform the Centre Secretary, and in turn, the Centre shall inform Bowls NZ, of such resignation. However the resignation shall not be effective until all moneys and obligations due to the Club by the Member in her/his capacity as a Member shall have been paid or met.
- (b) A Member shall be liable to pay the subscription set for the forthcoming year unless her/his resignation is received by the Secretary prior to the Annual General Meeting or for reasons satisfactory to the Executive.
- (c) The Secretary shall give to any Member whose resignation is effective, on request, a Clearance Certificate on the Bowls NZ approved form.
- (d) If any Member shall make default in payment of her/his subscription and other (if any) moneys due by her/him to the Club for a period of one month after written notice requiring her/him to pay the same shall have been given to her/him by the Secretary, the Executive Committee shall have power to determine her/ his membership and to report her/him to the Centre as a defaulter, but such Member shall not be relieved from liability to pay such moneys.
