

Oh So Close

Last Wednesday, Birkenhead's Mark Rumble, Lionel Drew (the God Father of the side, as called by Kevin Hickland), Randal Watkins and Nigel Drew were needing two more wins from four remaining games to qualify for post section in The 114th Taranaki Men's Open

Fours.

Wednesday saw Drew's team beat West End's Darren Scott (25-22) in the morning and then after lunch beat Pukekohe's Don Ramsey (21-20) and qualify for Friday's post section, knock out.

Thursday morning and a nothing game, except for pride, against Fitzroy's Neville Goldsworthy, down 10-8 at the break in a game that Drew said during the break "hard to get motivated for this one". Then went out and pulled off a 21-11 win with Goldsworthy conceding after 21 ends. Post section with all games played at West End. Drew was up against Masterton's John Clayton in the last 32, after both teams had the bye in the first round. Drew had his nose in front (6-10) going into the morning tea break after a tight 12 ends. The play remained tight with Drew and Clayton all locked up at 12 all after 18 ends and 13 all after 20 ends. Clayton was picking up singles shots while Drew had a three in his mix. One shot the difference to Drew after 24 ends (15-16). Playing the last end Drew was two shots down on the head. Clayton was heavy and dragged the jack back to Drew's back bowls then missed with his last and Drew didn't have to play his last picking up a three and the win (19-15), Drew spoke of the win after "Phew!!". Drew was into the last 16!!!

Saturday morning and back to the office up against Kensington's Dean McMurchy. As has been the case so often for Drew they had their nose in front going into morning tea (10-13 after 11 ends). Morning tea and in fact afternoon tea are great levellers at Taranaki. Drew quickly stepped out to a (12-21) lead after 18 ends. But then five consecutive ends to McMurchy saw the lead shorten (17-21) a two on the 24 end and Drew was in front (17-23) going into the last. A four to McMurchy on the last but Drew was still ahead (21-23), the win and a spot in the afternoons last 8.

The afternoon and being down going in to the tea break was not what Drew was a custom to, he was down (9-6) to Tower's Bruce Phillips. But this wasn't to last as Drew's side was locked in a tight contest throughout against Phillips. However, when they took the lead at 11-10 after 14 ends, they never relinquished it. Commencing the 25th end, Drew led by one. At the first attempt, Phillips killed the head with his last bowl. On the replay, Phillips' No 3, Scott Roberts, drew two beauties. Watkins reduced the count to one. But Phillips, with his last delivery, drew another fine shot. Nigel Drew, playing positively on the narrow hand, pushed one of his team's bowls in for shot to snatch victory (19-17). Sunday came and Mark Rumble, Lionel Drew, Randall Watkins and Nigel Drew out of one hundred and sixty-eight teams were in the last four! They were where no Birkenhead side

had been before, the semi-finals of the Taranaki Men's Open Fours. Up against West End's Jordan Linn, Dave Wilson, Steve Walker, Craig De Faria in initially misty/drizzle conditions, a far cry from the stunning week that had been. Drew got out to eight shot lead (1-9) after 4 ends, this is a 25 end game. De Faria pegged Drew back (8-10) after 9 ends. Still in Drew's favour (9-12) after 12 ends. Things had changed by the end 17 with De Faria leading (18-14). A lead De Faria never surrendered winning the semi (21-17) and ending Drew's run, oh so close.......

The final, Palmerston North's Brian Henn, Ron Henn, Ian Monaghan and Brian Little up against West End's De Faria. Playing superbly as a team, West End's Craig De Faria and his side of Jordan Linn, Dave Wilson and Steve Walker ran out comfortable winners (24-13) of the 114th Taranaki men's Open fours bowls tournament on their home greens.

Riverhead's Steve Cox and Grant Goodwin return for their eighth attempt at lifting the trophy, Cox/Goodwin a team that hasn't quite reached their potential in this tournament to date, could 2019 be their year?. They open their campaign against the lads from down state highway one, Frankton Railway's Barry Rajendram and Chris Lourie. Northcote's Brent Malcom and Takapuna's John Jenssen will have their work cut out for them up against Royal Oak Rockets Bowls3Five players Mike Galloway and Martin Dixon making their first appearance in the tournament's history.

Round Two and if you have lost the first round a win in this round is all important.

Eastbourne's Jamie Hill will be back in action this year on Birkenhead's greens with Tony Grantham

Combining their talents for a second year Auckland's Gary Breckon and Riverhead's Bart Robertson come up against newly crowned Birkenhead Men's Singles Champion Mark Rumble and Championship Fours skip Nigel Drew, both returning from a great Taranaki Men's Fours effort, a game sure to provide plenty of drawing and driving.

Past winner Carlton Cornwall's Vladimir (Wally) Marsic returns, after missing last year, with club mate Petar Sain in tow. They strike from the Far North, father and son Kerikeri's David Hood and Whangarei's Daniel Hood.

Orewa's Colin Rogan, holder of thirty North Harbour titles, has fellow club mate Murray Vallance off the front for a game that could go either way against Browns Bay's Grant Keats and Beach Haven's Garry Banks.

Howick up against Birkenhead sees Bryan Chapman and Neil Fisher duke it out with Peter Nathan and Randall Watkins.

Rising stars Belmont Park's Daryl Read and Glen Eden's Jeremy Brosnan go toe to toe with Birkenhead's Brian Wilson and Shane Gibson, possibly the game of the round.





Initially, Birkenhead was in Zone Four with Beach Haven, Northcote, Glenfield and Sunnybrae. Due to the number of entries, the Bowls North Harbour Match Committee has had to juggle the sections a little bit and as such the zones and nights being used has changed slightly. Birkenhead and Northcote the only entries in Zone 4, this Zone has gone and both clubs are now in Zone 3 on a Tuesday evening.
