

Our 77th Season Opens

Saturday saw over 130 members and guests gathered to welcome in the 77th season of The Birkenhead Bowling Club. Mother Nature played her part and the Opening Day mini tournament got away to the enjoyment of around 30 members. The official opening got underway just after 4pm. Gracing the top table were our Patrons Jonathan Coleman, Shane Prince, Bowls NZ Communications Manager Erin Nurkka, Bowls North Harbour President Maureen Taylor, our guest speaker Air New Zealand Captain and adventurer Mike Allsop accompanied by Chairperson Emmie Swart and President John Croy. Also present were Presidents from neighbouring clubs and a number of our Club Partners. Mike Allsop had everyone's attention as he told of his experiences surviving a plane crash in the Pacific, being one of the very small number of New Zealand climbers to have summited Mt Everest unguided, running seven marathons in seven days on seven continents, raising \$75,000 for charity, the adventures with his family, achieving his goals by breaking them down and fielded questions from the floor.

But this wasn't a talk about how to climb Everest or run a marathon. It was a talk about how to achieve the things that seem impossible. These core principles and tools will help those present draw parallels in their own life, both personally and professionally. He spoke from the heart about the power of goal setting. As a young boy from a single-

parent home, Mike's dream of becoming an Air New Zealand captain seemed impossible. But that didn't stop him from achieving that goal, nor did it stop him from climbing the world's highest mountain.

Hearing Mike recount his experiences took those in the room on a surprising, emotional journey of courage and companionship, life and death. More importantly, it helped them realise that there's no point in wondering 'what if?'

After Mike Allsop's inspiring talk it was on to the formalities of opening the

Since Vodafone launched its email service almost 20 years ago, email functionality has come a long way. They know their email service is no longer delivering the sort of experience that Kiwis need, which is why they have closed this service.
