Birkenhead Again

Eleven Birkenhead players spread through seven teams stepped out on the greens across North Harbour last Saturday in purist of BNH Mixed 242 Pairs glory. In recent history Birkenhead has a strong showing in this Centre event with one member, Daymon Pierson,

gaining a New Zealand title from the National finals back in 2016.

Section play done and dusted saw Birkenhead teams Gary Wallace and Mavis Smith along with Peter Nathan and Milika Nathan through to post section along with Daymon Pierson paired up with Orewa's Christeen Dalzell, and Lionel Drew with Mairangi's Theresa Rogers

Pierson/Dalzell saw off Wallace/Smith (14-8) in the quarter finals,

Drew/Rogers also moved forward to the semi finals with a one shot win (14-13). Birkenhead's farther and daughter combo, Peter and Milika bowed out going down (7-10) to Browns Bay's Brian Wilson and Orewa's Jan Harrison in a closely fought game.

Semis and for Birkenhead came an opportunity of a player in each of the final teams or the unthinkable of no one!.

Pierson/Dalzell beat Wilson/Harrison (10-8) while Drew/Rogers event came

to an end with a loss (14-15) to Takapuna's Trevor Forward & Connie Mathieson. The final and a chance for Pierson and Dalzell to move on to the National finals, but Forward and Mathieson stood in their way. After the completion of twelve ends only one shot separated the teams (11-10) but that all important one shot difference was in favour of Pierson and Dalzell and with it can the BNH Mixed 242 title, the first centre title of the 2020-21 season, the fourth centre title for Pierson, now only one off a gold star. 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Bowls New Zealand AGM

Behind the scenes of the 25th Bowls New Zealand Annual General Meeting

Last Saturday, the 25th Annual General Meeting of Bowls New Zealand was held at the Ponsonby Bowling Club in Auckland.

But it was a meeting like no others before it.

The Level 2.5 COVID lockdown in Auckland precluded gatherings of more than 10. So the traditional attendance by the 27 Centre delegates from throughout New Zealand, was instead replaced by a 'virtual' attendance by 25 of the 27 delegates via the digital platform Microsoft Teams.

Although the team at Bowls New Zealand of Martin Mackenzie, Erin Nurkka and Tamara Maher had already previously grappled with the technology to enable such remote collaborations within the bowls community, it was the first virtual annual general meeting for bowls.

"It was pretty stressful," remarked Nurkka. "Even though we've done live-streams before, there's a thousand things that can go wrong. Not only at our end, but at the delegates' end too."

"For instance, while we had delegates logging in to a 'waiting room' prior to the scheduled 10.00am start (a digital equivalent of television's 'green room'), we found we couldn't bring them on-line into the actual meeting as quickly as thought. We were pushed to start on time "

Bowls New Zealand Chief Executive, Mark Cameron, also initially found the experience challenging.

"It can be disarming just talking to a camera," observed Cameron. "And although you're facing an on-screen collage of the 25+ attendees, it's not the same as facing people in the flesh. You can see them ... but not hear them."

Bowls New Zealand Chair, Tony Lepper, also found the experience 'different'.

"Asking the meeting who's in favour of a motion, and who's against, takes a bit of getting used to when delegates are using an 'electronic hand' in Microsoft Teams. Fortunately, there weren't any contentious motions this year which required us to really test the voting process."

It's a difficult voting process at the best of times.

Like the electoral college system in the United States, each of the 27 Centre delegates has a varying number of votes at the annual general meeting.

"That ranges from the smallest centres with one vote like Bowls Gisborne-East Coast and Bowls Buller," explains Martin Mackenzie - on-hand as vote scrutineer. "Right up to the likes of Bowls Auckland with 5 votes and Bowls Canterbury with 7 votes. It's all based on their number of affiliated members."

The lack of controversy meant that the 2020 AGM was all over and done with in a record 30 minutes ... lock, stock and Chair's report (Tony Lepper), President's report (Mark O'Connor) and Chief Executive's report (Mark Cameron).

"The brevity of the meeting requires a little investigation," says Cameron. "Maybe there was in fact little to discuss. Or maybe the virtual AGM didn't easily allow engagement and comment. Or maybe our on-going communication had meant there were no surprises." Perhaps it was simply the financial health of Bowls New Zealand which prompted the brief AGM.

"Despite COVID, it was great to be able to report to the AGM a \$39,000 surplus for the financial year," says Cameron. "Including an increase in commercial revenue from the likes of Summerset, Prebble Seeds and APEX Insurance which reduced our reliance on affiliation fees."

Whatever the case, Bowls New Zealand will be following up with delegates to see what worked and what didn't work with this virtual meeting.

"Of course, we all hope things are back to normal this time next year. But maybe these virtual AGMs are a thing of the future ... either by necessity or design. There's pro's and cons: there's obviously a cost to traditional AGMs, but they're also an important opportunity to mix and mingle."

"We've now got \$2 million of reserves ... there for a rainy day," says Cameron. "With COVID, I guess it's fair to say it's raining now. So we're going to be using some of those reserves to invest more in the bowls community in the coming year."



This week we put the spotlight on "The Birkenhead Licensing Trust". Although not a sponsor, but with the Trust's support over the years the club has benefited from many grants. The Trust is a net proceeds-committee of the Lion Foundation and is responsible for approving grant funding to the local community groups in Birkenhead and surrounding areas from gaming funds generated by Lion Foundation.

The Birkenhead Licensing Trust was established in 1967 after voters decided that the Birkenhead Council area should change from 'dry' to 'wet' under the control of a licensing

In 1970 the Birkenhead Trust Hotel was opened, with catering facilities designed to cater for all locals.

A period of expansion was followed by the economic slump of the late 1980s, the recipe for a loss-making enterprise. In 1992 the trust hotel complex was sold and only the wholesale outlet retained.

The Birkenhead Licensing Trust then sat for a number of years.

accumulating revenue through the wholesale outlet and distributing interest accrued to local community groups. Meanwhile local licensing reins were loosened, allowing other operators to apply for licenses.

In the interim the Trust sought other suitable sites. In 2002 the Slipp Inn Pub had been opened by Allen Vaughan, who had a long history with Lion Breweries. In 2006 the Trust approached Mr Vaughan with an offer to buy the Slipp Inn, as it seemed a good fit for several reasons: the Trust is a net-proceeds committee of the Lion Foundation; grant funding to the local community comes from funds generated by Lion Foundation; the Trust was already the pub's landlord; the pub fitted the family-friendly ideal of the Trust; and the gambling facility was a source of revenue. The Pub undertook extensive renovations and was reborn as "The Good Home Birkenhead"

But, you ask, what is the difference between a Trust operation and a private or brewery-owned enterprise? Well, all profits from bar and restaurant sales and gaming proceeds are distributed in the local community through the Lion Foundation, rather than going into a big national pool for distribution nationally.

As Mr Vaughan points out, "The Trust does a lot of good in the community, it is not self-rewarding or ruled by self-interest, there are no paid directorships, and all six trustees are chosen by the electorate in the local body elections. As a result close to \$1 million annually has gone back into the community in recent years."

The Trust also owns the Glenfield pub Inn Field; revenues go back into the Birkenhead, Glenfield and Northcote areas from both establishments.
